Sts Peter & Paul's Old Cathedral is a rare and precious gem.

IT IS THE ONLY GREENSTONE CATHEDRAL IN THE WORLD. It was the mother church for southern NSW for over 100 years, and remains a physical and spiritual representation of Catholicism in Australia. It is also an invaluable link to the history, hardships and accomplishments of Australia's first inland city, Goulburn.

With such historical, architectural and religious significance, there is hope that the Cathedral will receive Papal blessing as a Minor Basilica. It would be only the sixth basilica in Australia. This will attract national and international pilgrims and tourists to visit the Cathedral precinct. We want them to experience the Cathedral at it's best.

But this beautiful and important building is literally wasting away. Years of decay and damage are taking their toll. The Cathedral desperately needs restoration, repair and renewal to ensure its survival for the future.

Our goal is not to only repair the damage and bring the Cathedral back to its former glory, but to enhance the surrounding precinct and create a haven of hope and love for pilgrims, parishioners, the local community and visitors.

We are the custodians of this building and its legacy. It urgently needs our help.

The Archdiocese of Canberra and Goulburn have committed \$5 million to support this essential restoration project. We are now seeking your support to raise the additional funds needed to bring this treasured piece of history back to life. We aim to complete the project in time to celebrate the Cathedral's 150th anniversary in November 2022. Achieving this goal will take many hands, hearts and graces.

A monument of 19th-century Gothic **Revival design and** craftsmanship

Designed in 1871 by Italian born stonemason and architect Andrea Stombuco, Sts Peter & Paul's Cathedral features many examples of Gothic Revival architecture. The pointed arches, steep rooves and castle-like tower are central to Stombuco's design. Stunning, vibrant stained-glass windows adorn the walls of the Cathedral and depict various Saints, the triple tiara of the Pope, the sword and palm leaves of St Paul and the keys and inverted cross of St Peter. The Cathedral is also home to one of the largest and best-preserved Hill & Son organ in Australia, installed in 1890.

Building on past restoration efforts

Over the past thirty years there have been a number of restorations works undertaken to combat the deterioration of the Old Cathedral.

A stronghold of Catholic faith and community

STS PETER & PAUL'S CATHEDRAL is inextricably linked with the growth of a thriving Catholic community in southern NSW. The Old Cathedral was the mother church of the Archdiocese of Goulburn for over 100 years.

As only the second Cathedral to be built in NSW, it was a central place of faith and community for Catholics spread from Camden to the Victorian border.

As the cornerstone of such a vibrant parish, it played a significant role in the Catholic faith flourishing in the region. And it continues to be a dynamic and historical hub of Catholic heritage and ecclesiastical life.



Our Cathedral

struggles, achievements and dreams. The growth of the Goulburn diocese mirrored the growth of Australia's first inland city and the surrounding regions. The Cathedral has witnessed Peter & Paul's Old Cathedral played a significant role in the spiritual and academic education of generations of children through the former St Patrick's College, Our Lady of Mercy, St Josephs Secondary School and St Patricks Technical School. Today it holds the historical records from many of the surrounding parishes, providing an invaluable resource for people tracing their family history.

Through government grants and the generosity of the local Parish, significant work was done to underpin the foundations of the building to prevent further sinking and water damage. At various times the Sanctuary, roof and gutters have been repaired, stonework rebuilt, the organ restored, the interior re-wired and re-lit, and stained glass windows revived. While these individual projects have extended the life and use of the Cathedral, they have only tackled the most pressing needs. They have not been enough to ensure the permanent protection of the building for the future. As each year passes, the effort required to restore the Old Cathedral exterior and interior becomes larger and more expensive.

And so, the Repair, Restore and Renew project has commenced, with the aim to not only fix urgent damage, but to revive the Old Cathedral and surrounding precinct to secure its long term future as the rare gem that it is.





Sts Peter & Paul's **Old Cathedral**

- + The only greenstone cathedral in the world
- + Built in 1872 and designed by Italian architect and stonemason Andre Stombuco
- Second Catholic cathedral to be built in NSW
- Constructed using locally quarried diorite porphyrite (greenstone)
- Granted NSW heritage status in 2006
- + Houses one of the finest and best preserved Hill & Son organ in Australia
- + Features exquisite stained glass window artwork from Belgium
- + Looking to be granted status as Australia's sixth Minor Basilica

Sts Peter & Paul's Old Cathedral is so much more than a church

We must take action now to preserve the Old Cathedral and renew the surrounding Precinct to guarantee this invaluable piece of history survives for the future.

Our Plans

The work to be completed is essential to the protection, permanent conservation and enhancement of the Old Cathedral. Without the support of generous donors to fund the restoration, we risk losing this heritage listed building and its legacy.

This ambitious restoration project includes four phases. We are committed to honouring Stombuco's design and retaining the architectural integrity of the Cathedral. We will be replacing and restoring features with the same materials as original, "like for like", while incorporating modern design principles like drainage and temperature control to protect the building for generations to come.

We hope to have the project completed in time for the Cathedral's 150th anniversary in November 2022.

PHASE 1

The first priority is the protection of the Bell Tower and repair of the exterior walls. After years of weathering and decay, the walls are suffering from water damage and structural deterioration. This phase is already underway.

PHASE 2


Work will continue to repair and upgrade the rest of the Old Cathedral exterior, including replacement of roof tiles, diversion of water away from the building, improved drainage, guttering work and roof plumbing. Completion of this phase will give the protection needed to begin restoration of the interior.

PHASE 3

Restoration of the Cathedral interior will then begin, including repairing the walls, stained glass windows, wiring, floor tiling and parquetry, improving the heating and installing a sound system that better meets the needs of the Cathedral's users and visitors.

PHASE 4

Work then moves beyond the Old Cathedral to begin the enhancement of the surrounding precinct. A major part of this phase will be the repurposing of the former St Brigid's school building into a Heritage Centre. Other work will include restoration and upgrades to the former Bishop's House, convent, and former St. Patrick's school.





LANDSCAPE PLAN

Proposed Cathedral Precinct

The design celebrates the history of the community and built form with planting of the Callistemon Saint Mary MacKillop and City of Goulburn Rose Bush and the recycling and reuse of the bricks from the school's toilets in the proposed columbarium, adjacent the location of the historic toilet block. The columbarium will feature a commemorative plaque acknowledging this time in Goulburn's history.
